



CI Alternative Investment Grade Credit Fund (Series A units) July 8, 2025

This document contains key information you should know about CI Alternative Investment Grade Credit Fund (the "fund"). You can find more detailed information in the fund's simplified prospectus. Before you invest in any fund, you should consider how it works with your other investments and your tolerance for risk.

This fund is an alternative mutual fund. It has the ability to invest in asset classes or use investment strategies that are not permitted for conventional mutual funds. The specific strategies that differentiate this fund from conventional mutual funds include: increased use of derivatives for hedging and non-hedging purposes; increased ability to sell securities short; and the ability to borrow cash to use for investment purposes. While these strategies will be used in accordance with the fund's investment objectives and strategies, during certain market conditions they may accelerate the pace at which your investment decreases in value.

What does the fund invest in?

The fund seeks to generate consistent positive total returns with an emphasis on capital preservation and low correlation to traditional equity and fixed income markets. The fund will be primarily invested in the investment grade debt of corporations and financial institutions in the developed world.

The fund will use leverage. The leverage will be created through the use of cash borrowings, short sales and derivative contracts. The fund's leverage must not exceed three times the fund's net asset value. The leverage will be calculated in accordance with the methodology prescribed by securities laws, or any exemptions therefrom.

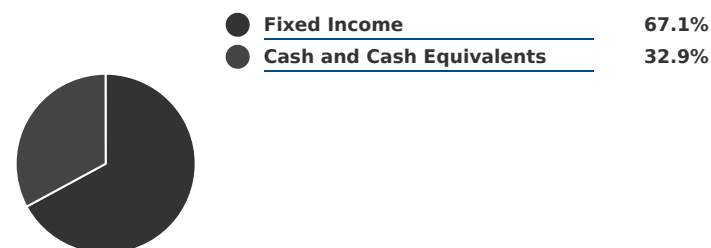

How risky is it?

The value of the fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

Risk rating

CI Global Asset Management has rated the volatility of this fund as **low to medium**.

Generally, the rating is based on how much the fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

Like most mutual funds, this fund doesn't have any guarantees. You may not get back the amount of money you invest.

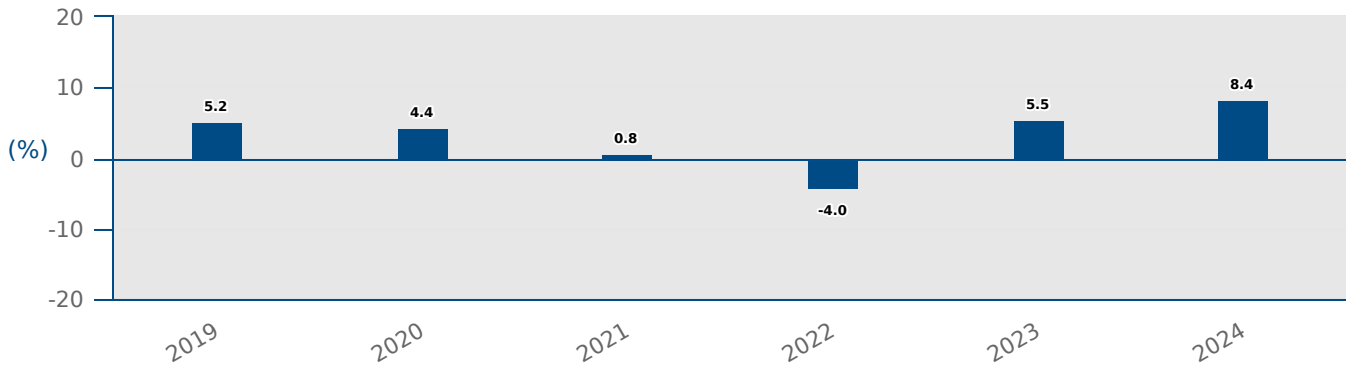
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How has the fund performed?

This section tells you how Series A securities of the fund have performed over the past 6 calendar year(s). Returns are after expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the fund's returns.

Year-by-year returns

This chart shows how Series A securities of the fund performed in the past 6 calendar year(s). This fund series dropped in value in 1 of the last 6 calendar year(s). The range of returns and change from year to year can help you assess how risky the fund has been in the past. It does not tell you how the fund will perform in the future.



Best and worst 3-month returns

This table shows the best and worst returns for Series A securities of the fund in a 3-month period over the past 6 calendar year(s). The best and worst 3-month returns could be higher or lower in the future. Consider how much of a loss you could afford to take in a short period of time.

Average return

As at May 31, 2025, a person who invested \$1,000 in Series A securities of the fund since inception has \$1,205. This works out to an annual compounded rate of return of 2.9%.

Who is this fund for?

This fund may be suitable for you if you:

- are seeking income and long-term capital appreciation
- are seeking to reduce sensitivity to interest rate fluctuations
- are seeking exposure to global investment grade credit and active credit trading strategies
- are seeking consistent returns over the market cycle
- are seeking an investment which can utilize borrowing, short-selling, leverage and derivatives where appropriate to either maximize returns or mitigate negative returns
- can tolerate low to medium risk

A word about tax

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws of where you live and whether you hold the fund in a registered plan, such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan or a Tax-Free Savings Account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund in a non-registered account, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

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How much does it cost?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Series A securities of the fund. The fees and expenses — including any commissions — can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

1. Sales charges

You can only buy Series A securities of the fund under the initial sales charge option. However, you can switch to Series A securities of the fund under a deferred sales charge option if such option(s) are available and you are switching from securities held under such option(s) of a fund managed by us. The deferred sales charge schedule will be based on the date you bought the first fund, and the rates and duration of such schedule shall continue to apply.

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2. Fund expenses

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the fund series' returns.

As at December 31, 2024, the total fund series' expenses were 3.75%. This equals \$37.50 for every \$1,000 invested.

The fund may pay the Manager a performance fee at the end of each year equal to 10% of the amount by which the net asset value per security at the end of such year (such net asset value being adjusted by adding the amount of distributions paid and/or payable by the fund since the High Water Mark (as defined in the simplified prospectus) was determined and excluding the accrual of the performance fee during the year) exceeds the High Water Mark multiplied by one plus the Hurdle Rate (as defined in the simplified prospectus), multiplied by the number of securities of such series outstanding at the end of such year. If any securities of the fund are redeemed prior to the end of a year, a performance fee will be payable on the redemption date in respect of each such security, as if the redemption date were the end of the year. Performance fees will be calculated and accrued for each series on a daily basis during each year. As at December 31, 2024, the Management Expense Ratio (excluding performance fees and their applicable taxes) was 2.74%.

More about trailing commission

The trailing commission is an ongoing commission. It is paid for as long as you own the fund. It is for the services and/or advice that your representative and their firm provide to you.

CI Global Asset Management pays the trailing commission to your representative's firm. It is paid from the fund's management fee and is based on the value of your investment. The rate depends on the sales charge option you choose.

The standard and intermediate deferred sales charge trailing commission rates each change to the initial sales charge trailing commission rate upon completion of your deferred sales charges schedule.

3. Other fees

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch securities of the fund.

Fee	What you pay
Short-term trading fee	Up to 2% of the net asset value of the securities you redeem, if we determine that you have engaged in inappropriate short-term trading, which may occur if you sell or transfer your securities within 30 days of buying them. This fee goes to the fund.
Transfer fee	Your representative's firm may charge you up to 2% of the net asset value of securities you switch to another fund.
Program minimum fee	If you participate in one of our managed programs, we may charge you an annual fee of up to 0.15% of the net asset value of the applicable series of securities in the fund within the program, payable to us quarterly by the redemption of securities (without charges), if your investment is less than the program minimum.
Reclassification fee	If you are switching Series A, AH, AT5, AT6, AT8, U, UT6, Z or ZZ securities to a different series of securities of the same fund, you may have to pay to us a reclassification fee if you hold your securities under a deferred sales charge option. This fee is equal to the redemption fee you would pay if you redeemed such securities.
NSF cheque fee	There is a \$25 charge for all cheques returned because of insufficient funds.

What if I change my mind?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual funds securities within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
