Before you invest, consider how the ETF would work with your other investments and your tolerance for risk.

CI Global Asset Management proposes to change the investment objective of the ETF, as well as its name to CI Canadian Short-Term Aggregate Bond Index ETF on or about April 5, 2024. For further information, please see Amendment No. 1 to the prospectus of the ETF dated May 31, 2023.

If approved at a special meeting of the ETF to be held on or about March 5, 2024, the investment objective of the ETF will be changed to "The ETF seeks to track, to the extent reasonably possible, the price and yield performance of a Canadian short-term investment grade bond index, before fees and expenses. Currently, the ETF seeks to track the FTSE Canada Short Term Overall Bond Index™ (the "Index") or any successor thereto." Pending the approval of the investment objective change, the management fee will be reduced to 0.07%.

What does the ETF invest in?

Outals facts

The ETF seeks to track, to the extent reasonably possible, the price and yield performance of the Bloomberg Canadian Short Aggregate Enhanced Yield Index (the "Index"), before fees and expenses. The investment strategy of the ETF is to invest in and hold the constituent securities of the Index in the same proportion as they are reflected in the Index or otherwise invest in a manner intended to track the price and yield performance of the Index (e.g., sampling). As an alternative to or in conjunction with investing in and holding the constituent securities, the ETF may invest in or use certain other securities to obtain exposure to the price and yield performance of the Index. The Index is designed to broadly capture the short-term Canadian investment grade, fixed income securities market while seeking to enhance yield within desired risk parameters and constraints. The Index uses a rules-based approach to include subgroups of the Bloomberg Canadian Aggregate Index (i.e., treasuries, government-related, credit and securitized debt) with effective maturities generally shorter than five years ("CAD ST Agg Universe") and to re-weight such subgroups with the aim of earning a higher yield while broadly retaining the risk characteristics of the CAD ST Agg Universe. To be eligible for the CAD ST Agg Universe and for inclusion in the Index, debt securities must be rated investment grade, have a fixed rate coupon, have at least \$150 million in par amount outstanding, be denominated in Canadian dollars and have at least one year to final maturity.

The charts below give you a snapshot of the ETF's investments on October 31, 2023. The ETF's investments will change to reflect changes in the Index.

How risky is it?

The value of the ETF can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much an ETF's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, ETFs with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. ETFs with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

How has the ETF performed?



Year-by-year returns

Average return

As at October 31, 2023, a person who invested \$1,000 in this series of securities of the ETF since inception has \$1,061. This works out to an annual compounded rate of return of 0.9%.

Trading ETFs

ETFs hold a basket of investments, like mutual funds, but trade on exchanges like stocks. Here are a few things to keep in mind when trading ETFs:

Pricing

ETFs have two sets of prices: market price and net asset value (NAV).

Market price

- ETFs are bought and sold on exchanges at the market price. The market price can change throughout the trading day. Factors like supply, demand, and changes in the value of an ETF's investment can affect the market price.
- You can get price quotes any time during the trading day. Quotes have two parts: bid and ask.
- The bid is the highest price a buyer is willing to pay if you want to sell your ETF securities. The ask is the lowest price a seller is willing to accept if you want to buy ETF securities. The difference between the two is called the "bid-ask spread".
- · In general, a smaller bid-ask spread means the ETF is more liquid. That means you are more likely to get the price you expect.

Net asset value (NAV)

- · Like mutual funds, ETFs have a NAV. It is calculated after the close of each trading day and reflects the value of an ETF's investments at that point in time.
- · NAV is used to calculate financial information for reporting purposes like the returns shown in this document.

Orders

There are two main options for placing trades: market orders and limit orders. A market order lets you buy or sell securities at the current market price. A limit order lets you set the price at which you are willing to buy or sell securities.

Timing

In general, market prices of ETFs can be more volatile around the start and end of the trading day. Consider using a limit order or placing a trade at another time during the trading day.

Who is this ETF for?

Investors who:

- want to invest in a broad range of fixed income securities which are Canadian dollar denominated
- · can handle the ups and downs of the stock market

A word about tax

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on an ETF. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the ETF in a registered plan such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan, or a Tax-Free Savings Account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your ETF in a non-registered account, distributions from the ETF are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

How much does it cost?

This section shows the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell this series of securities of the ETF. Fees and expenses, including any trailing commissions, can vary among ETFs.

Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other ETFs and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

1. Brokerage commissions

You may have to pay a commission every time you buy and sell securities of the ETF. Commissions may vary by brokerage firm. Some brokerage firms may offer commission-free ETFs or require a minimum purchase amount.

2. ETF expenses

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the ETF's returns.

As of June 30, 2023, the ETF's expenses were 0.21% of its value. This equals \$2.10 for every \$1,000 invested.

Trailing commission

The trailing commission is an ongoing commission. It is paid for as long as you own the ETF. It is for the services and advice that your representative and their firm provide to you.

What if I change my mind?
