Management Report of Fund Performance for the period/year ended December 31, 2023

INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGIES

The investment objective of the CI Balanced Growth Asset Allocation ETF (the Fund) is to provide long-term capital growth with a potential for a moderate level of income, primarily by investing in Exchange-Traded Funds (ETFs) that provide exposure to a portfolio of global equity and fixed income securities.

In order to achieve its investment objective, the Fund invests in global equity and fixed-income securities. The Portfolio Manager seeks to maintain a long-term strategic asset allocation of approximately 70% equity securities and 30% fixed income securities (under normal market conditions). The portfolio asset mix may be reconstituted and rebalanced from time to time at the discretion of the Portfolio Manager.

RISK

No changes affecting the overall level of risk associated with investing in the Fund were made during the period/year. The risks of the Fund remain as discussed in the Fund's most recently filed simplified prospectus or its amendments. The Manager reviews the risk rating for the Fund on an annual basis, at a minimum, based on the methodology mandated by the Canadian Securities Administrators to determine the risk level of the Fund. Any change to the risk rating made during the period/year was as a result of such review and was not a result of any change to the investment objective, strategies or management of the Fund.

RESULTS OF OPERATIONS

As at December 31, 2023, the Fund's net asset value were \$2.1 million. The Fund had net sales of \$2.1 million for the period.

Inflation continued to decline during the period. Central banks signalled that their job to battle inflation was almost done and that interest rate cuts may be coming soon. This shift in central bank policy ignited a sharp rebound in the value of both bonds and stocks in the final quarter of 2023. In certain asset classes, including Canadian bonds, U.S. bonds, real estate and Canadian small-capitalization equities, the fourth-quarter return turned the full-year return from negative to positive. This, once again, reminded investors about the importance of staying invested.

U.S. large-capitalization stocks, as measured by the S&P 500 Index, finished the period at 4,783 points, which is just 14 points below the all-time high, which was recorded on January 3, 2023. High inflation appeared to have been short-lived, along with high interest rates and poor stock performance.

The Fund has been in existence less than one year and, as such, there is no attribution information available.

RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

The Fund is positioned for what may happen in the medium-to-long term rather than what may take place in the near term. The Fund has exposure to companies that we expect to benefit from lowering interest rates, stable economic growth and ongoing innovation.

On the theme of innovation, Apple Inc. is expected to launch its Vision Pro in the first quarter of 2024. It could be the next popular gadget to own after iPod, iPad, iPhone and Apple Watch. The company's failure or success is likely to have a direct and significant impact on S&P 500 Index performance given Apple Inc.'s significant weight in the index. Innovation has continued to drive stock prices higher in the United States, particularly in the current competition for dominance in artificial intelligence (AI). The largest information technology giants have all committed to spending in AI initiatives, in the hundreds of billions of dollars.

Unfortunately, this leaves small-cap companies out of the game. Al chip maker NVIDIA Corp. is busier than ever to meet demand and is also upgrading its products to compete. 2024 is set up to be an interesting year, with potentially larger-than-expected boosts from less restrictive monetary policies and from innovation.

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Manager, Portfolio Manager and Trustee

CI Investments Inc. is the Manager, Portfolio Manager and Trustee of the Fund. CI Investments Inc. is a subsidiary of CI Financial Corp. The Manager, in consideration of management fees, provided management services required in the day-to-day operations of the Fund.

The Manager, in respect of the Fund, received the following standing instructions from the Independent Review Committee (IRC) with respect to related party transactions:

The applicable standing instructions require, amongst others, that related party transactions be conducted in accordance with the Manager's policies and procedures and applicable law and that the Manager reports related party transactions periodically to the IRC and advise the IRC of any material breach of such policies. The Manager's policies and procedures require that investment decisions in respect of related party transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to the Manager and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to the Manager; (b) represent the business judgment of the Manager, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) do not exceed the limitations of the applicable legislation; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

Except as otherwise noted above under Related Party Transactions section, the Fund was not a party to any related party transactions during the period/year ended December 31, 2023. If the Fund invested in related party transactions, it relied on the IRC's standing instructions regarding related party transactions during this reporting period/year.
