Management Report of Fund Performance for the period/year ended December 31, 2023

INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGIES

The investment objective of the CI Yield Enhanced Canada Short-Term Aggregate Bond Index ETF (the Fund) is to track, to the extent possible, the price and yield performance of the Bloomberg Canadian Short Aggregate Enhanced Yield Index (the Benchmark or the Index) before fees and expenses. The Index is designed to broadly capture the short-term Canadian investment grade fixed income securities market while seeking to enhance yield within desired risk parameters and constraints.

The investment strategy of the Fund is to invest in and hold a proportionate share of the constituent securities of the Index or otherwise invest in a manner intended to track the price and yield performance of the Index. The Fund may also invest in or use certain other securities to obtain exposure to the price and yield performance of the Index.

RISK

No changes affecting the overall level of risk associated with investing in the Fund were made during the period/year. The risks of the Fund remain as discussed in the Fund's most recently filed simplified prospectus or its amendments. The Manager reviews the risk rating for the Fund on an annual basis, at a minimum, based on the methodology mandated by the Canadian Securities Administrators to determine the risk level of the Fund. Any change to the risk rating made during the period/year was as a result of such review and was not a result of any change to the investment objective, strategies or management of the Fund.

RESULTS OF OPERATIONS

The Fund's net assets increased by \$3.4 million to \$44.0 million from December 31, 2022 to December 31, 2023. The Fund had net sales of \$2.2 million for the year. The portfolio's performance increased assets by \$2.5 million. The Fund paid distributions totalling \$1.3 million. Non-Hedged units returned 5.2% after fees and expenses for the one-year period ended December 31, 2023. Over The same time period, The Fund's benchmark returned 8.3%. The benchmark is the Bloomberg Canadian Aggregate Short Enhanced Yield Total Return Index (The Benchmark or The Index).

During the year, central banks continued to tighten monetary policy to combat inflation. The Bank of Canada (BoC) raised its overnight rate by 50 basis points (bps) to 5.00%. The U.S. Federal Reserve Board raised the federal funds rate by 150 bps to 5.50%. Yield curves remained inverted. In Canada, bond yields declined somewhat, with the two-, 10- and 30-year yields declining 16 bps, 19 bps and 25 bps, respectively.

Inflation in Canada dropped for the year, from 6.3% to 3.1% (for November 2023). Inflation in the United States showed a similar pattern, down to 3.1% from 6.5%.

Credit spreads (the difference between the yield on corporate bonds over government bonds) on Canadian corporate bonds tightened somewhat, by approximately 30 bps. Credit spreads on provincial bonds were barely changed, down 8 bps in aggregate.

The Fund underperformed its benchmark for the year. The largest individual detractors from the Fund's performance were positions in Province of Ontario 3.6% Mar. 8, 2028, Canada Housing Trust No. 1 2.65% Mar. 15, 2028 and Province of Ontario 2.9% Jun. 2, 2028 bonds.

Top individual contributors to the Fund's performance included holdings in Government of Canada 0.5% Sep. 1, 2025, Canada Housing Trust No. 1 2.35% Jun. 15, 2027 and Canada Housing Trust No. 1 1.9% Sep. 15, 2026 bonds.

RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

There is risk of a recession in 2024. An inverted yield curve has proven to be an accurate leading indicator for recession. This would benefit bond yields overall if the BoC began a monetary easing program by lowering the overnight interest rate and could cause the yield curve to revert to a positive slope. However, if a recession were to occur, it would likely cause credit spreads on corporate and provincial bonds to widen, which would result in underperformance of those asset classes relative to federal government bonds. While the timing and severity of a recession is difficult to predict, some analysts are predicting a soft landing, meaning slower economic growth but with no recession.

In Canada for 2024, the Overnight Index Swap (OIS) curve is pricing in interest rate cuts from the BoC totalling 100 bps starting in April. This would take the BoC's overnight rate from 5.00% to end the year at 4.00%. The U.S. OIS curve is showing a similar outlook, with a total of 140 bps in interest rate cuts forecasted to take the federal funds rate to 4.00% by year-end 2024.

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In the Fall Economic Statement, the Dept of Finance estimated that the net federal debt to GDP ratio would continue to rise this year and next, from 41.7% to 42.7%. This projection may prove to be a bit optimistic as it assumes no decrease in spending and (as this government has done since elected in 2015) relies on GDP growth to achieve this lower ratio. While not ideal for bond investors, as it ensures increased supply of government bonds (an additional \$38.4b by their estimate), the amount of added debt is likely to be manageable and absorbed by the bond market.

Amendment to the Declaration of Trust

Effective May 30, 2023, the declaration of trust for the Fund was amended, mainly to conform with current practice within the securities industry and to update the benchmarks names for certain Funds. Manager, Investment Advisor and Trustee

CI Investments Inc. is the Manager, Investment Advisor and Trustee of the Fund. CI Investments Inc. is a subsidiary of CI Financial Corp. The Manager, in consideration of management fees, provided management services required in the day-to-day operations of the Fund.

The applicable standing instructions require, amongst others, that related party transactions be conducted in accordance with the Manager's policies and procedures and applicable law and that the Manager reports related party transactions periodically to the IRC and advise the IRC of any material breach of such policies. The Manager's policies and procedures require that investment decisions in respect of related party transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to the Manager and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to the Manager; (b) represent the business judgment of the Manager, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) do not exceed the limitations of the applicable legislation; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

Except as otherwise noted above under Related Party Transactions section, the Fund was not a party to any related party transactions during the period/year ended December 31, 2023. If the Fund invested in related party transactions, it relied on the IRC's standing instructions regarding related party transactions during this reporting period/year.


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PAST PERFORMANCE

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Annual Compound Returns

The Bloomberg Canadian Short Aggregate Enhanced Yield Index provides exposure to short term investment grade Canadian bonds including Treasury, corporate and ABS/MBS debt. Using a screening process and weighting methodology, the Index reweights the various subgroups to achieve a higher yield compared to its parent Index.

The Bloomberg Canadian Short Aggregate Composite Index is a market-value weighted combination of Treasury, government-related and corporate securities with 1-5 remaining years to maturity.
