Management Report of Fund Performance for the period/year ended June 30, 2024

RESULTS OF OPERATIONS

The Fund's net assets increased by \$22.6 million to \$177.4 million from December 31, 2023 to June 30, 2024. The Fund had net sales of \$15.3 million for the period. The periodic's performance increased assets by \$9.6 million. The Fund paid distributions totalling \$2.3 million. Common Units returned 6.2% after fees and expenses for the six-month period ended June 30, 2024. Over the same time period, the Fund's benchmark returned 6.2%. The benchmark is the Solactive Canada Broad Market Net Total Return Index (the Benchmark or the Index).

Economic weakness in Canada became more apparent during the period given the household sector's higher sensitivity to interest rates. The economy escaped recession in the second half of 2023 but continued to fall short of expectations so far in 2024. This was despite support from strong population growth, which is projected to slow significantly in the quarters ahead.

Signs of a slowdown in U.S. economic activity appeared as restrictive monetary policies worked their way through major developed economies with long and variable lags. While U.S. economic growth continued to outperform its peers, a softening became evident in the second quarter of 2024.

In June 2024, the Bank of Canada (BoC) lowered its overnight policy rate by 25 basis points (bps) to 4.75%. This was the first change to the policy interest rate since July 2023, and it marked the first critical step toward lower interest rates.

The U.S. Federal Reserve Board left its policy interest rate on hold in June 2024, but the global monetary easing cycle began with other central banks, including the BoC, lowering their key policy interest rates in response to slowing economic growth and moderating inflationary pressures. Disappointing U.S. inflation data led to fears of a reacceleration during the first quarter of 2024 and resulted in a significant decrease in expectations for interest rate cuts relative to the start of the year. However, more recent data revealed that price pressures were moderating. U.S. labour market data was mixed, but the trend also suggested a slowing.

U.S. equities were up for the period, with particular strength from the information technology sector, which appreciated almost 30%. Artificial intelligence (Al) adoption boosted spending and investment, benefiting U.S. companies and potentially driving growth in China and India. Corporate earnings driven by technological advancements continued to support equity returns.

The Fund underperformed its benchmark over the period. The Fund's allocations to the communication services, real estate and health care sectors detracted from performance. The largest individual detractors from the Fund's performance were positions in The Toronto-Dominion Bank, Shopify Inc. and Bank of Montreal.

Exposure to the energy, financials and materials sectors contributed to the Fund's performance. Top individual contributors to the Fund's performance included holdings in Royal Bank of Canada, Manulife Financial Corp. and Suncor Energy Inc.

RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

We are cautiously optimistic as we look toward the second half of 2024. Equity markets have been buoyed by the prospect of interest rate cuts by leading central banks as well as the enthusiasm for all things related to the Al boom. We see indications of softer economic activity due to weakening of consumer spending trends. Softer economic growth along with moderating inflationary trends are the leading arguments for lower interest rates. Any extension of the higher interest rate environment may lead to a recalibration of equity valuations.

As population growth slows in Canada, long-term potential growth prospects could hinge on an improvement in productivity, which has been on a downward trend for several years. Al provides some hope and may lead to improvement if adoption is successful. However, broader government policy support is necessary to drive long-term investment and competitiveness.

We believe that the BoC will make at least two additional 25-bp cuts to its policy interest rate by year-end. However, even with these cuts, a large number of mortgages are due to renew at considerably higher interest rates in 2025, posing a challenge to the Canadian economy.

While lower borrowing costs suggest a cyclical bottom in home sales is approaching, we expect housing activity is unlikely to rebound meaningfully in the near term. The inventory of existing homes for sale has continued to rise as sales activity remains slow. Rent price pressures are also easing, suggesting overall housing is returning to better equilibrium.

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RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Manager, Portfolio Manager and Trustee

CI Investments Inc. is the Manager, Portfolio Manager and Trustee of the Fund. CI Investments Inc. is a subsidiary of CI Financial Corp. The Manager, in consideration of management fees, provided management services required in the day-to-day operations of the Fund.

These transactions are executed through market intermediaries and under prevailing market terms and conditions. The Independent Review Committee (IRC) reviews such transactions during scheduled meetings. During the period/year ended June 30, 2024, the Fund engaged in related issuer trading or held position(s) in CI Financial Corp. at the end of the period/year.

Independent Review Committee

The Manager, in respect of the Fund, received the following standing instructions from the IRC with respect to related party transactions:

The applicable standing instructions require, amongst others, that related party transactions be conducted in accordance with the Manager's policies and procedures and applicable law and that the Manager reports related party transactions periodically to the IRC and advise the IRC of any material breach of such policies. The Manager's policies and procedures require that investment decisions in respect of related party transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to the Manager and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to the Manager; (b) represent the business judgment of the Manager, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) do not exceed the limitations of the applicable legislation; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

Except as otherwise noted above under Related Party Transactions section, the Fund was not a party to any related party transactions during the period/year ended June 30, 2024. If the Fund invested in related party transactions, it relied on the IRC's standing instructions regarding related party transactions during this reporting period/year.


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PAST PERFORMANCE
