## **INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGIES**

The investment objective of the CI Global Balanced Yield Private Pool (the Fund) is to provide a balance of income and long-term capital appreciation by investing primarily in global fixed-income securities and dividend-paying equity securities.

In accordance with its investment objective, the Fund:

- will invest primarily in global fixed-income and/or equity securities, with the fixedincome component and equity component each ranging between 40-60% of the Fund;
- in respect of the fixed-income component, invest primarily in a combination of global investment grade fixed-income securities and high yield fixed-income securities of any type, while maintaining an average credit rating of BBB- or higher for this portion of the portfolio;
- may invest all of its assets in foreign securities; and
- may invest in private placements or other illiquid equity or debt securities of public or private companies as permitted by securities regulations.

The Fund currently achieves its investment objective by investing all of its assets in multiple underlying mutual funds (the Underlying Funds).

For a complete discussion of the Fund's and the Underlying Funds' respective investment objective and strategies, please refer to the Fund's and the Underlying Funds' most recently filed simplified prospectus.

#### RISK

No changes affecting the overall level of risk associated with investing in the Fund were made during the year. The risks of the Fund remain as discussed in the Fund's most recently filed simplified prospectus or its amendments. The Manager reviews the risk rating for the Fund on an annual basis, at a minimum, based on the methodology mandated by the Canadian Securities Administrators to determine the risk level of the Fund. Any change to the risk rating made during the year was as a result of such review and was not a result of any change to the investment objective, strategies or management of the Fund.

## **RESULTS OF OPERATIONS**

The Fund's net assets increased by \$5.3 million to \$43.2 million from March 31, 2020 to March 31, 2021. The Fund had net sales of \$1.4 million during the year. The portfolio's performance increased assets by \$5.8 million. The Fund paid distributions totalling \$1.9 million. Series A units returned 17.5% after fees and expenses for the one-year period ended March 31, 2021. Over the same time period, the Fund's benchmark returned 13.3%. The benchmark is a combination of the ICE BofAML Global Broad Market Total Return Index - 50% and the MSCI World Total Return Index – 50% (the Benchmark or the Index).

The performance of the Fund's other Series is substantially similar to that of Series A units, except for differences in the structure of fees and expenses. For the returns of the Fund's other Series, please refer to the "Past Performance" section.

The following commentary pertains to the results of operations of the Underlying Funds.

Significant fiscal support by global policy makers was quickly introduced to offset the economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. These efforts helped to support a recovery in the second half of 2020. Major central banks around the world reintroduced significant quantitative easing measures to support the fiscal effort. Favourable testing of COVID-19 vaccines created positive expectations for economic re-openings by the summer of 2021. However, as a result of differing vaccine supply and distributions across economies, economic re-opening efforts have been unequal across major economies.

The Fund outperformed its benchmark largely as a result of an overweight exposure to equities and security selection within the financials sector. An overweight allocation to credit and high-yield bonds also contributed to the Fund's performance. The largest individual contributors to performance were an equity position in Alphabet Inc. and a Permanent TSB Group Holdings PLC, 8.625% bond. The bond, issued by an Irish bank, was redeemed during the year after it recovered with Ireland's economy.

Stock selection within the United Kingdom detracted from the Fund's performance as did security selection within the information technology sector. Individual detractors from the Fund's performance included a position in London Stock Exchange Group PLC and U.S. Treasury, 2.0% Feb. 15, 2050. The long-term Treasury bond lost value as yields rose late in the year.

At the height of economic shutdowns that resulted from the pandemic, riskier securities were priced lower. In response to fiscal spending and positive vaccine news, these securities rebounded strongly for the most part. We added new holdings in McDonald's Corp. stock and UnitedHealth Group Inc., 2.0% May 15, 2030 to the Fund, and increased existing equity positions in Microsoft Corp. and Amazon.com Inc. Roche Holding AG was eliminated from the Fund and Cigna Corp. was trimmed.

# **RECENT DEVELOPMENTS**

The U.S. economy is forecasted to grow strongly over the next few months, but the Canadian economy is likely to struggle under COVID-19 variants until the vaccine rollout is further advanced. We will maintain the Fund's exposure to U.S. equities and selectively add to Canadian equities in the coming months.

## Cl Investments Inc. rebrands as Cl Global Asset Management Inc.

On November 10, 2020, CI Investments Inc. announced that it is rebranding to CI Global Asset Management Inc. The rebrand is underway and is scheduled to be completed by the end of the first quarter of 2021. With the rebrand, legacy in-house investment boutique brands will be phased out and they will operate under CI Global Asset Management. The affected brands are Cambridge Global Asset Management, Harbour Advisors, Sentry Investment Management, and Signature Global Asset Management.

## **RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS**

#### Manager, Portfolio Advisor, Trustee and Registrar

CI Investments Inc. is the Manager, Portfolio Advisor, Trustee and Registrar of the Fund. CI Investments Inc. is a subsidiary of CI Financial Corp. The Manager, in consideration for management fees, provides management services required in the day-to-day operations of the Fund. The Manager bears all of the operating expenses of the Fund (other than taxes, borrowing costs and new governmental fees) in return for an administration fee.

The Manager received \$0.4 million in management fees and \$0.05 million in administration fees for the year.

#### Management Fees

Approximately 26% of total management fees were used to pay for sales and trailing commissions. The remaining 74% of management fees were used to pay for investment management and other general administration.

## **Related Fund Trading**

Related fund trading occurs when a Fund purchases or sells units/shares of another Fund managed by the Manager. During the year ended March 31, 2021, the Fund engaged in related fund trading or held position(s) in related fund(s) at the end of the year.

## Independent Review Committee

The Fund has received standing instructions from the Fund's IRC to make or hold an investment in the security of an issuer related to the Manager.

The applicable standing instructions require, amongst others, that related party transactions be conducted in accordance with the Manager's policies and procedures and applicable law and that the Manager advise the IRC of any material breach of such policies. The standing instructions also require that investment decisions in respect of related party transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to the Manager and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to the Manager; (b) represent the business judgment of the Manager uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) are made in compliance with the Manager's policies and procedures; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund. Quarterly, the IRC reviews reports which assess compliance with applicable CI policies. Annually, the IRC reviews reports describing each instance that the Manager acted in reliance on the standing instructions noted above.

The Fund relied on the IRC's standing instructions regarding related party transactions during this reporting year.

Except as otherwise noted above, the Fund was not a party to any related party transactions during the year ended March 31, 2021.

(4) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the fiscal year. The higher a Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a higher turnover rate and the performance of a Fund. Portfolio turnover rate is calculated by dividing the lesser of the cost of purchases and the proceeds of sales of portfolio securities for the year, and excluding cash and short-term investments maturing in less than one year, and before assets acquired from a merger, if applicable, by the average of the monthly fair value of investments during the year.


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# PAST PERFORMANCE

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# Annual Compound Returns

The ICE BofAML Global Broad Market Index tracks the performance of investment grade public debt issued in the major domestic and eurobond markets, including global bonds.

The MSCI World Index is a free float-adjusted market capitalization weighted index that is designed to measure the equity market performance of developed markets. The Index consists of the following 23 developed market country indices: Australia, Austria, Belgium, Canada, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Hong Kong, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Japan, Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Portugal, Singapore, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, the United Kingdom and the United States of America.
