

## CI Alternative Diversified Opportunities Fund (Series Y units) May 5, 2022

**Before you invest in any fund, you should consider how it works with your other investments and your tolerance for risk.**

This fund is an alternative mutual fund. It has the ability to invest in asset classes or use investment strategies that are not permitted for conventional mutual funds. The specific strategies that differentiate this fund from conventional mutual funds include: increased use of derivatives for hedging and non-hedging purposes; increased ability to sell securities short; and the ability to borrow cash to use for investment purposes. While these strategies will be used in accordance with the fund's investment objectives and strategies, during certain market conditions they may accelerate the pace at which your investment decreases in value.

### What does the fund invest in?

The fund's investment objective is to achieve capital appreciation and provide unitholders with attractive risk adjusted returns over an investment cycle. The fund may use leverage. The leverage will be created through the use of cash borrowings, short sales and derivative contracts. The fund's leverage must not exceed three times the fund's net asset value. The leverage will be calculated in accordance with the methodology prescribed by securities regulations, or any exemptions therefrom.

The charts below give you a snapshot of the fund's investments on March 31, 2022. The fund's investments will change.

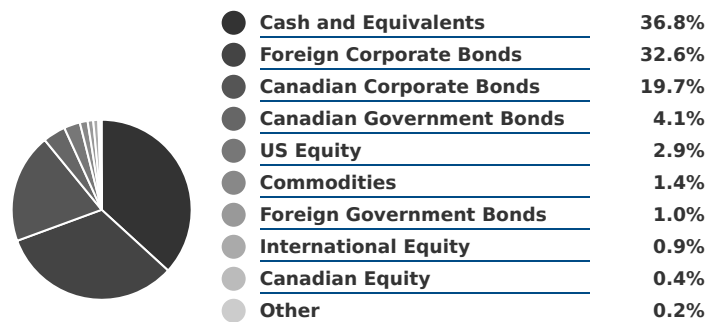

### How risky is it?

The value of the fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

### Risk rating

The Manager has rated the volatility of this as **low to medium**.

The rating is based on how much the fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

Like most mutual funds, this fund doesn't have any guarantees. You may not get back the amount of money you invest.

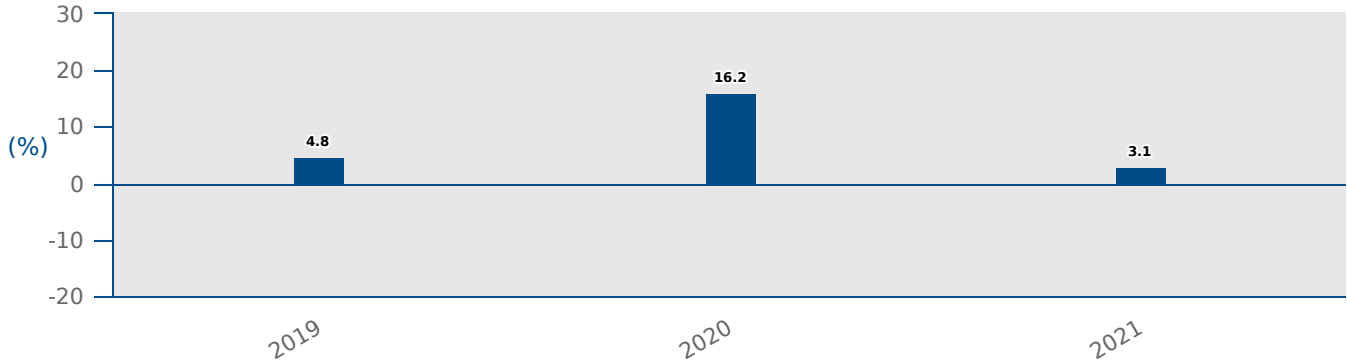
# CI Alternative Diversified Opportunities Fund (Series Y units)

## How has the fund performed?

This section tells you how Series Y securities of the fund have performed over the past 3 calendar year(s). Returns are after expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the fund's returns.

### Year-by-year returns

This chart shows how Series Y securities of the fund performed in each of the past 3 calendar years. This fund series has not dropped in value in the last 3 calendar years. The range of returns and change from year to year can help you assess how risky the fund has been in the past. It does not tell you how the fund will perform in the future.



### Best and worst 3-month returns

This table shows the best and worst returns for Series Y securities of the fund in a 3-month period over the past 3 calendar year(s) to March 31, 2022. The best and worst 3-month returns could be higher or lower in the future. Consider how much of a loss you could afford to take in a short period of time.

### Average return

As at March 31, 2022, a person who invested \$1,000 in Series Y of the fund since inception has \$1,268. This works out to an annual compounded rate of return of 6.4%.

The information and data disclosed above relates to a time period prior to the fund becoming a reporting issuer. The expenses of this series of the fund would have been higher during such period had the fund been subject to the additional regulatory requirements applicable to a reporting issuer. This information and data is disclosed as permitted by exemptive relief.

## Who is this fund for?

### This fund may be suitable for you if you:

- are seeking capital appreciation and attractive risk adjusted returns over an investment cycle
- are investing for the medium and/or long term
- are seeking an investment which can utilize borrowing, short-selling, leverage and derivatives where appropriate to either maximize returns or mitigate negative returns
- can tolerate low to medium risk

## A word about tax

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws of where you live and whether you hold the fund in a registered plan, such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan or a Tax-Free Savings Account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund in a non-registered account, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

## How much does it cost?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Series Y securities of the fund. The fees and expenses — including any commissions — can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

### 1. Sales charges

There are no sales charges applicable to your series of securities.

### 2. Fund expenses

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the fund series' returns. As at December 31, 2021, the total fund series' expenses were 0.94%. This equals \$9.40 for every \$1,000 invested.

<b>Management expense ratio (MER)</b> This is the total of the fund series' management fee, performance fee, administration fee, and Certain Fund Costs.	0.84%
<b>Trading expense ratio (TER)</b> These are the fund series' trading costs.	0.10%

The fund may pay the Manager a performance fee at the end of each year equal to 15% of the amount by which the net asset value per unit at the end of such year (before giving effect to any distributions by the fund since the High Water Mark (as defined in the simplified prospectus) was determined, and adjusted to exclude the accrual of the performance fee during the year) exceeds the High Water Mark multiplied by one plus the Hurdle Rate (as defined in the simplified prospectus), multiplied by the number of units of that series outstanding at the end of such year. If any units of the fund are redeemed prior to the end of a year, a performance fee may be payable on the redemption date in respect of each such units, as if the redemption date were the end of the year. Performance fees will be calculated and accrued for each series on a daily basis during each year. Effective August 6, 2021, this series of the fund has changed the way certain operating expenses are charged by introducing a fixed administration fee. Please see the prospectus of the fund for more details.

### More about trailing commission

CI Global Asset Management does not pay a trailing commission on your series of securities out of the fund's management fee.

### 3. Other fees

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch securities of the fund.

Fee	What you pay
<b>Short-term trading fee</b>	Up to 2% of the net asset value of the securities you redeem, if we determine that you have engaged in inappropriate short-term trading, which may occur if you sell or transfer your securities within 30 days of buying them. This fee goes to the fund.
<b>Transfer fee</b>	Your representative's firm may charge you up to 2% of the net asset value of securities you switch to another fund.
<b>Program minimum fee</b>	If you participate in one of our managed programs, we may charge you an annual fee of up to 0.15% of the net asset value of the applicable series of securities of the fund within the program, payable to us quarterly by the redemption of securities (without charges), if your investment is less than the program minimum.
<b>Investment advisory fee</b>	You may be charged an investment advisory fee, the amount of which is negotiated between you and your representative (acting on behalf of the representative's firm) and collected by your representative's firm. Series Y securities are available only to investors who participate in fee-based programs through their representatives' firms. In certain cases, we will collect the investment advisory fee on behalf of your representative's firm (by redeeming (without charges) a sufficient number of securities from your account on a quarterly basis). In these cases, the investment advisory fee must not exceed 1.50% annually of the net asset value of Series Y securities in the fund in your account.
<b>NSF cheque fee</b>	There is a \$25 charge for all cheques returned because of insufficient funds.

## What if I change my mind?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual funds securities within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
