



Invesco Canadian Fund (to be renamed CI AIMvest Canadian Fund) - Series A

This document contains key information you should know about Invesco Canadian Fund (the "Fund"). You can find more detailed information in the Fund's simplified prospectus. Before you invest in any fund, consider how the fund would work with your other investments and your tolerance for risk.

Notice: On June 1, 2026, CI Global Asset Management became the manager and portfolio manager of the Fund, following the sale of management agreements relating to Invesco Canada Ltd.'s Canadian fund business to CI Global Asset Management. Effective on or about July 31, 2026, the Fund's name will be changed as described above. The "Invesco" mark will remain in the name of the Fund until such time, however, as of June 1, 2026, neither Invesco Canada Ltd. nor any of its affiliates provides management or portfolio management services to the Fund.

New purchases under the Deferred Sales Charge option, Low Load option or Lower Load 4 option are no longer permitted. If you currently hold shares or units of a CI Global Asset Management fund under any of these purchase options, you may make a permitted switch to the Fund under the same purchase option. In such circumstances, you will maintain the redemption fee schedule and rates outlined in the simplified prospectus offered in the year those other Fund shares or units were originally purchased.

What does the Fund invest in?

The Fund invests in a diversified portfolio of common shares and other equity securities of Canadian businesses. The Fund is permitted to invest up to 49% of its non-cash assets in foreign securities.

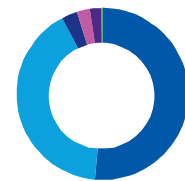

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How risky is it?

The value of the Fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge the risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility."

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

Risk rating

CI Global Asset Management has rated the volatility of this Fund as **Medium**.

This rating is based on how much the Fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the Fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

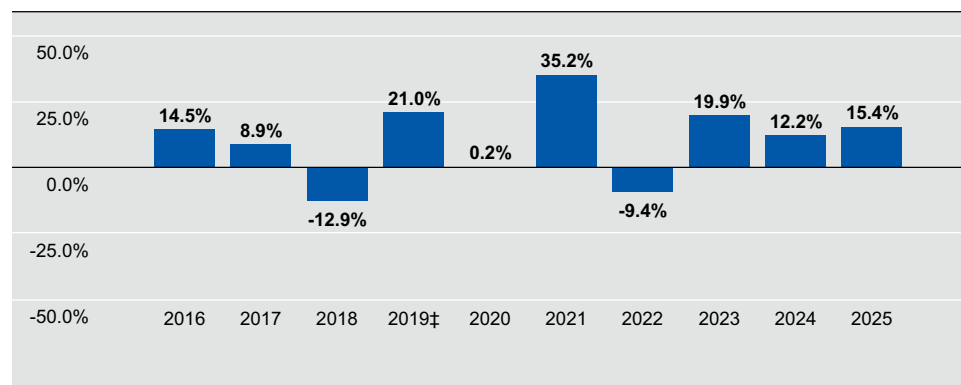
Like most mutual funds, this Fund doesn't have any guarantees. You may not get back the amount of money you invest.

How has the Fund performed?

This section tells you how Series A units of the Fund have performed over the past 10 years. Returns are after expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the Fund's returns.

Year-by-year returns

This chart shows how Series A units of the Fund performed in each of the past 10 years. The Fund dropped in value in two of the 10 years. The range of returns and change from year to year can help you assess how risky the Fund has been in the past. It does not tell you how the Fund will perform in the future.



† During the period a gain from tax refund proceeds was recognized to reflect expected tax recoveries attributable to the Fund. This positively impacted the performance of this series of the Fund and is not expected to persist.

Best and worst three-month returns

This table shows the best and worst returns for the Series A units of the Fund in a three-month period over the past 10 years. The best and worst three-month returns could be higher or lower in the future. Consider how much of a loss you could afford to take in a short period of time.

Average return

A person who invested \$1,000 in Series A units of the Fund 10 years ago now has \$2,580. This works out to an annual compound return of 9.94%.

Who is this Fund for?

Investors who:

- Want strong capital growth over the long term
- Own, or plan to own, other types of investments to diversify their holdings
- Are comfortable with a Canadian equity fund that may have substantial foreign holdings
- Are comfortable with medium risk

The Fund is not appropriate if you have a short-term investment horizon.

A word about tax

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether you hold the fund in a registered plan, such as a registered retirement savings plan or a tax-free savings account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund in a non-registered account, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

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How much does it cost?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Series A units of the Fund. The fees and expenses, including any commissions, can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

1. Sales charges

You may pay a sales charge when you buy Series A units of the Fund.

2. Fund expenses

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the Fund's returns.

As of December 31, 2025, the expenses of Series A were 2.72% of the value of this series. This equals \$27.20 for every \$1,000 invested.

Annual rate (as a % of the Fund's value)

Management expense ratio (MER)

This is the total of the Fund's management fee (which includes the trailing commission) and operating expenses.

More about the trailing commission

The trailing commission is an ongoing commission. It is paid for as long as you own the Fund. It is for the services and advice that your representative and their firm provide to you. CI Global Asset Management pays the trailing commission to your representative's firm. It is paid from the Fund's management fee and is based on the value of your investment. The rate depends on the sales charge option you choose.

3. Other fees

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch Series A units of the Fund.

Fee	What you pay
Short-term trading fee	If you redeem or switch within 30 days of purchase, CI Global Asset Management reserves the right to charge, on behalf of the Fund, a short-term trading fee of 2% on top of any other fees that may apply.
Switch fee	Your representative's firm may charge you a fee of up to 2% of the value of the units you switch to another CI Global Asset Management fund. You and your representative negotiate the fee.

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What if I change my mind?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual funds within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document,

or

- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase or, in some jurisdictions, claim damages if the simplified prospectus, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities legislation in your province or territory.
