# WHAT DOES THE FUND INVEST IN?

The Fund invests primarily in real estate investment trusts ("**REITs**"), equity securities of corporations carrying on business in the real estate sector and debt or convertible debt issued by REITs and real estate corporations. The Fund may invest up to 30% of the net asset value in equity securities and convertible debentures of non-Canadian REITs and corporations carrying on business in the real estate sector, so long as such securities are listed or quoted on a major North American exchange. At the Fund Manager's discretion, the Fund may be invested entirely in cash or cash equivalents.

## HOW RISKY IS IT?

The value of the Fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

### RISK RATING

The Fund Manager has rated the volatility of this Fund as **Medium.** 

This rating is based on how much the Fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the Fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.



# HOW HAS THE FUND PERFORMED?

## Year-by-Year Returns

This chart shows how Series F units of the Fund performed in each of the past 10 calendar years. This Fund series dropped in value in 1 of the last 10 calendar years. The range of returns and change from year to year can help you assess how risky the Fund has been in the past. It does not tell you how the Fund will perform in the future.



# Best and Worst 3-month Returns

This table shows the best and worst returns for Series F units of the Fund in a 3-month period over the past 10 calendar years to March 31, 2022. ## HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Series F units of the Fund. The fees and expenses – including any commissions – can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

### 1. Sales Charges – You do not pay any sales charges when Series F units are acquired or redeemed.

2. Fund Expenses – You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the Fund's returns. As of December 31, 2021, the expenses of the Series F units of the Fund were 1.30% of their value. This equals \$13.00 for every \$1,000 invested.

3. Other Fees - You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch Series F units of the Fund.

Transfer Fee	Your dealer may charge you up to 2% of the net asset value of units you switch to another Fund.
Short-Term Trading Fee	Up to 2% of the net asset value of the units you redeem within 30 days of purchase. This fee goes to the Fund.
Investment Advisory	You may be charged an investment advisory fee, the amount of which is negotiated between you and your
Fee	representative (acting on behalf of the dealer) and collected by your dealer. Series F units are available only to investors who participate in fee-based programs through their dealer. In certain cases, the Fund Manager will collect the investment advisory fee on behalf of your dealer (by redeeming (without charges) a sufficient number of units from your account on a quarterly basis). In these cases, the investment advisory fee must not exceed 1.50% annually of the net asset value of Series F units of the Fund in your account.

#### WHAT IF I CHANGE MY MIND?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual funds within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or fund facts document, or
- (ii) cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, fund facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
