What does the fund invest in?

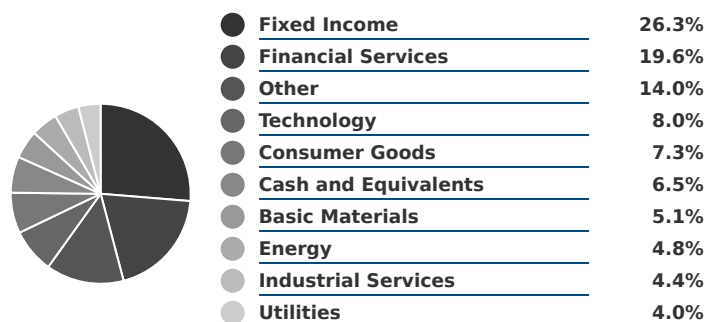
The fund invests primarily in equity and equity-related securities of mid to large capitalization Canadian companies and fixed income securities issued by Canadian governments and companies. It is currently expected that investments in foreign securities will generally be no more than 49% of the fund's assets.

How risky is it?

The value of the fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

Risk rating

CI Investments Inc. has rated the volatility of this fund as low to medium.

Generally, the rating is based on how much the fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

How has the fund performed?

This section tells you how Series Y securities of the fund have performed since inception. Returns are after expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the fund's returns.

Year-by-year returns

This section shows how this series of securities of the fund have performed in past calendar year(s). However, this information is not available because the series is new.

Best and worst 3-month returns

Average return

Who is this fund for?

This fund may be suitable for you if you:

- want both equity and fixed income securities in a single fund and prefer to have the portfolio adviser make the asset mix decisions
- are investing for the medium term
- can tolerate low to medium risk

A word about tax

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws of where you live and whether you hold the fund in a registered plan, such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan or a Tax-Free Savings Account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund in a non-registered account, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

How much does it cost?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Series Y securities of the fund. The fees and expenses — including any commissions — can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

1. Sales charges

There are no sales charges applicable to your series of securities.

2. Fund expenses

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the fund series' returns.

The fund series' expenses are made up of the management fee, administration fee, trading costs, and Certain Fund Costs. Series Y's annual management fee is 0.85% of the fund series' value and Series Y's fixed administration fee is 0.18% of the fund series' value. Because Series Y is new, its Certain Fund Costs and trading costs are not available.

More about trailing commission

CI Investments Inc. does not pay a trailing commission on your class of securities out of the fund's management fee.

3. Other fees

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch securities of the fund.

Fee	What you pay
Short-term trading fee	Up to 2% of the net asset value of the securities you redeem, if we determine that you have engaged in inappropriate short-term trading, which may occur if you sell or transfer your securities within 30 days of buying them. This fee goes to the fund.
Transfer fee	Your representative's firm may charge you up to 2% of the net asset value of securities you switch to another fund.
Program minimum fee	If you participate in one of our managed programs, we may charge you an annual fee of up to 0.15% of the net asset value of the applicable series of securities of the fund within the program, payable to us quarterly by the redemption of securities (without charges), if your investment is less than the program minimum.
Investment advisory fee	You may be charged an investment advisory fee, the amount of which is negotiated between you and your representative (acting on behalf of the representative's firm) and collected by your representative's firm. Class Y securities are available only to investors who participate in fee-based programs through their representatives' firms. In certain cases, we will collect the investment advisory fee on behalf of your representative's firm (by redeeming (without charges) a sufficient number of securities from your account on a quarterly basis). In these cases, the investment advisory fee must not exceed 1.50% annually of the net asset value of Class Y securities in the fund in your account.
NSF cheque fee	There is a \$25 charge for all cheques returned because of insufficient funds.

What if I change my mind?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual funds securities within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, annual information form, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
