Management Report of Fund Performance for the period/year ended March 31, 2023

INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND STRATEGIES

The investment objective of CI Global Infrastructure Private Trust (the Fund) is to provide income and capital appreciation by investing primarily in equity securities of issuers with either direct or indirect exposure to infrastructure located anywhere in the world.

The Fund uses a fundamental, bottom-up approach to investing. The Fund defines infrastructure as those physical assets that society requires to facilitate its orderly operation, such as those related to transport, energy, water, communications and social purposes.

The Fund has the ability to invest up to all of the Fund's assets in foreign securities.

RISK

No changes affecting the overall level of risk associated with investing in the Fund were made during the period/year. The risks of the Fund remain as discussed in the Fund's most recently filed simplified prospectus or its amendments. The Manager reviews the risk rating for the Fund on an annual basis, at a minimum, based on the methodology mandated by the Canadian Securities Administrators to determine the risk level of the Fund. Any change to the risk rating made during the period/year was as a result of such review and was not a result of any change to the investment objective, strategies or management of the Fund.

RESULTS OF OPERATIONS

The Fund's net assets decreased by \$4.1 million to \$12.6 million from March 31, 2022 to March 31, 2023. The Fund had net redemptions of \$2.9 million during the year. The portfolio's performance increased assets by \$0.4 million. The Fund paid distributions totalling \$1.6 million. Series I units returned 3.1% after fees and expenses for the one-year period ended March 31, 2023. Over the same time period, the Fund's benchmark returned 4.4%. The benchmark is the S&P Global Infrastructure Total Return Index (the Benchmark or the Index).

Over the year, authorities and financial markets continued to grapple with high inflation, which led most central banks around the world to significantly raise interest rates. This drove down the value of bonds and reduced stock market valuations and returns significantly. Economic growth was maintained, but a slowdown, with the potential for a recession in some regions, began to be expected sometime in 2023. Geopolitically, Russia's war against Ukraine heightened markets' perceptions of geopolitical risks, while the end of China's zero-COVID policy helped to provide a boost to global economic conditions.

The Fund underperformed its benchmark for the year. Currency hedges detracted from the Fund's performance, largely as a result of the decline of the Canadian dollar in relation to the U.S. dollar. The largest individual detractors from the Fund's performance were Union Pacific Corp. and Enel SPA. Union Pacific Corp. was negatively impacted by fears around an economic slowdown in the United States. Enel SPA's stock was affected by political and regulatory concerns in Italy.

Security selection within the telecommunications and transportation infrastructure sub-sectors contributed most to the Fund's performance. An overweight allocation to the energy sector also contributed to the Fund's performance. Geographically, an overweight exposure to Europe and other non-U.S. geographies contributed to the Fund's performance. Top individual contributors to the Fund's performance were Vinci SA, Grupo Aeroportuario del Pacifico SAB de CV and Cheniere Energy Inc. Vinci SA benefited from rebounding transportation concessions as the industry began to rebound after COVID-19 pandemic-induced travel restrictions. Grupo Aeroportuario del Pacifico SAB de CV's share price climbed amid a rebound in travellers to Mexico. Cheniere Energy Inc. benefited from higher liquefied natural gas prices, and delivered on a variety of corporate priorities, including new contracts, debt reduction and returns to shareholders via buybacks and dividends.

We added new positions in Grupo Aeroportuario del Pacifico SAB de CV and Tidewater Midstream and Infrastructure Ltd. to the Fund, and increased existing positions in Vinci SA, Transurban Group, OGE Energy Corp., Ferrovial SA, RWE AG and Equinix Inc. Holdings in Flughafen Wien AG, Keyera Corp., Vantage Towers AG, Enel SPA and Union Pacific Corp. were eliminated from the Fund. We trimmed Fund holdings in Equatorial Energia SA, Atlas Arteria Ltd., NextEra Energy Inc., Canadian Pacific Railway Ltd. and Cheniere Energy Inc.

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RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

Looking forward, we expect that economic growth is likely to moderate in most developed markets, but we do not expect a deep recession. With inflation likely to moderate but remain higher than in recent history, we note the value of infrastructure's inflation-protected revenues and stable business models.

The Fund has an overweight exposure to energy infrastructure, consistent with the moderate valuations and high free cash flow yields of many firms in this sub-sector and the growing importance of stable North American energy production. The Fund is also positioned in utility companies that are likely to benefit from energy transition funding and mandates across the world promoting decarbonization.

Administrator

Effective November 14, 2022, RBC Investor Services Trust ceased acting as the administrator to the Fund and CIBC Mellon Global Securities Services Company started acting as the administrator to the Fund.

Independent Review Committee

Effective October 6, 2022, John Sheedy became a member of the Independent Review Committee (IRC) of CI Funds.

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Manager, Portfolio Adviser, Trustee and Registrar

CI Investments Inc. is the Manager, Portfolio Adviser, Trustee and Registrar of the Fund. CI Investments Inc. is a subsidiary of CI Financial Corp. The Manager, in consideration for management fees, provides management services required in the day-to-day operations of the Fund. The Manager bears all of the operating expenses of the Fund (other than borrowing and interest costs, investor meeting costs (as permitted by Canadian securities regulation), the fees and expenses of the Independent Review Committee, the fees, costs and expenses associated with compliance with any new governmental and regulatory requirements imposed on or after February 16, 2018 and new governmental fees or with any changes to existing governmental and regulatory requirements imposed on or after February 16, 2018 (including increases to regulatory filing fees), any new types of costs, expenses or fees not incurred prior to February 16, 2018, including those arising from new government or regulatory requirements or related to those external services that were not commonly charged in the Canadian mutual fund industry as of February 16, 2018, and operating expenses that were or are outside the normal course of business of the Fund on or after February 16, 2018) in return for an administration fee.

The Fund only offers Series I units, thus management and administration fees are negotiated directly with each investor and paid directly to the Manager as per Series I Account Agreement Fee. Please refer to Part A of the simplified prospectus for further details.

Inter Fund Trading

Inter fund trading occurs when a Fund purchases or sells a security of any issuer from or to another Fund managed by the Manager. These transactions are executed through market intermediaries and under prevailing market terms and conditions. The IRC reviews such transactions during scheduled meetings. During the period/year ended March 31, 2023, the Fund executed inter fund trades.

Independent Review Committee

The Manager, in respect of the Fund, received the following standing instructions from the IRC with respect to related party transactions:

The applicable standing instructions require, amongst others, that related party transactions be conducted in accordance with the Manager's policies and procedures and applicable law and that the Manager reports related party transactions periodically to the IRC and advise the IRC of any material breach of such policies. The Manager's policies and procedures require that investment decisions in respect of related party transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to the Manager and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to the Manager; (b) represent the business judgment of the Manager, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) do not exceed the limitations of the applicable legislation; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

Except as otherwise noted above under Related Party Transactions section, the Fund was not a party to any related party transactions during the period/year ended March 31, 2023. If the Fund invested in related party transactions, it relied on the IRC's standing instructions regarding related party transactions during this reporting period/year.

(3) The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the period/year, including the Fund's proportionate share of such expenses of any underlying fund(s), if applicable.

(4) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the fiscal period/year. The higher a Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a period/year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the period/year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the period/year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a higher turnover rate and the performance of a Fund. Portfolio turnover rate is calculated by dividing the lesser of the cost of purchases and the proceeds of sales of portfolio securities for the period/year, and excluding cash and short-term investments maturing in less than one year, and before assets acquired from a merger, if applicable, by the average of the monthly fair value of investments during the period/year.

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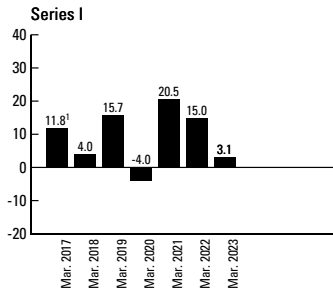
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PAST PERFORMANCE
